- “The Biggest Day on Snow, All Year“
- 2017 marks the fourth (6th) edition of World Snow Day
- It is various activities taking place simultaneously around the world on a single weekend (always the 3rd Sunday in January)
- Part of the international FIS Campaign ‘Bring Children to the Snow‘

- Over 500 events in 35 countries
